was on the front porch, with a gun, pounding on the door. The Police Department received other calls from area residents reporting a disturbance and shots fired. Officers found the suspect, a 29 year old male resident of Troy, on the front porch attempting to pry open the front door with a fireplace poker. Officers located several empty shell casings on the ground, but could not find the bullets. Officers recovered a Raven .25 caliber semi automatic pistol, reported as stolen to the Flint Police Department in 1986, from beneath a bag of rock salt on an adjoining condominium's porch. Officers learned that the suspect and his wife argued at their home earlier in the morning. She sought shelter for herself and their 7 month old son at the complainant's home. The suspect soon arrived at his brother's home in an attempt to get his wife to talk to him. He was extremely agitated, kicking and striking the door with his fists. Witnesses report the suspect retreated to his automobile and fired a handgun four times. He returned to the porch and was attempting to pry the door open when police officers arrested him. Investigators released the 29 year old male resident of Troy from custody pending further investigation. Once their investigation is complete, they will present the case to the Oakland County Prosecutor's Office for warrant consideration and criminal prosecution.

Police Officers responded to eight other incidents involving domestic disputes or family troubles in which there were no reasons for formal enforcement action.

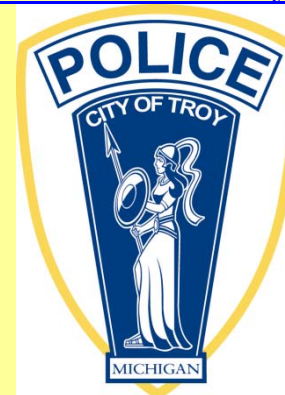

Retail Fraud

Home Invasion / B&E

Always secure your doors and windows.

- Garages and door walls are targets for thieves.
- Always ensure your garage door and pedestrian doors are secured.
- Do not leave garage door remote controls in cars not parked in the garage.
- Use 1 1/2" dowel rod in the track of all sliding glass windows and doors to help prevent them from opening.
- It has been proven time and time again that the proper use and application of physical security will stop a would-be burglar.
- Burglary alarms are only as reliable as the person setting them. If you have an alarm, make sure that every resident or employee knows how to activate and deactivate it, as well as the security code.

- Installing a car alarm.
- Using steering-wheel locking applications like the club etc.

- There is a trend of things being stolen from vehicles in the parking lots of fitness centers and fun centers. While going to these places, be extra careful to remove all items of value and secure your vehicle.
- Remember that nothing that is worth anything is free.

Case Updates

Arrests in S/E Michigan Larceny from Automobile and Home Invasion Incidents

In the months of October and November, numerous cities in southeastern Michigan and northern Ohio experienced similar incidents of larcenies from automobiles in which many of the vehicle owners subsequently became victims of home invasions. The suspects were targeting movie theater and restaurant parking lots. They would steal remote garage door openers and GPS units from the vehicles. The suspects

➤ If someone that you do not know offers to do you a favor, they probably have an ulterior motive.

➤ Never give any personal information out to an unknown source over the phone or Internet.

(If someone asks for personal information, ask to speak to his or her supervisor and inform him or her you will be calling the Police to make a fraud report.)

No reputable business will call you or email you for this information!!!

➤ If you receive a phone call or email telling you that you have won something that you did not apply for, it is more than likely a fraud.

➤ No legitimate organization will ask for any money or a Credit Card number in order to claim a prize

➤ Protect yourself against identity theft by shredding all documents and safe guarding your account numbers, social security numbers and credit card numbers.

➤ Always maintain your credit cards and secure the credit card numbers.

would use information programmed into the GPS units or vehicle registrations to identify the location of victims' homes.

A larceny from an automobile at Chuck-E-Cheese, 740 John Rd., on November 11 resulted in a home invasion in Royal Oak. In addition, a larceny from an automobile at the Troy Sports Center, 1819 East Big Beaver Road (CFS #2009-33680), on November 23 resulted in a home invasion in Berkley.

As a result of the cooperative efforts of numerous police agencies, which included the exchange of intelligence information, investigators developed two suspects in these incidents.

Troy Police Department investigators posted a photograph of the suspects' white 1998 Chevrolet pickup truck, obtained from parking lot surveillance video at 740 John R, on the Michigan Intelligence Operations Center network (MIOC).

The Detroit Police Department reported suspicious pawn activities in their city by a 23 year old male resident of Trenton and a 23 year old male resident of Rockwood to the Trenton Police Department. The Trenton Police Department shared the information with the Riverview Police Department, as both cities were experiencing similar larcenies from automobiles and home invasions.

Police Officers from the Troy, Auburn Hills, Bloomfield Township, Riverview, Trenton and Sylvania, Ohio Police Departments began to track the activities of the suspects.

As the investigation was progressing, a witness reported a larceny from an automobile in progress to the Pittsfield Township Police Department on November 25. A Pittsfield Township Police Officer was monitoring the same parking lot at the time as a result of shared intelligence information on the suspects. Pittsfield Township Officers arrested the two suspects for the Pittsfield Township incident.

The Troy Police Department assisted the Riverview and Trenton Police Departments

Identity theft continues to be the fastest growing crime in the world, and the city of Troy is no exception. We continually get reports of identity theft and fraud on a regular basis.

While it may not be totally avoidable, detecting the early signs of identity theft is one of the best ways to avoid extensive losses and damage to your credit history.

If your wallet/purse etc. gets stolen, cancel all stolen credit and ATM cards immediately.

Checking your credit history regularly is a great way to keep apprised on the status of your credit.

with two search warrants at the Trenton suspect's home on November 26 and 27. A substantial amount of stolen property was recovered, which included property stolen from the Berkley home invasion.

The Troy investigation into the larcenies from automobiles continues. Investigators believe these suspects may also have been involved with another larceny from an automobile at Chili's Restaurant, 402 West 14 Mile Road, on November 23. Investigators have not yet obtained arrest warrants in the Troy incidents.

The suspects arrested by the Pittsfield Township Police Department may be responsible for crimes in Berkley, Clinton Township, Commerce Township, Dearborn Heights, Grosse Pointe, Livonia, Monroe County, New Haven, Pittsfield Township, Riverview, Royal Oak, Southgate, Trenton, Troy, West Bloomfield, Wixom, Woodhaven and Sylvania, Ohio.

Somerset Pontiac, 1850 West Maple Road: On 12/05/09, Troy Police plain clothes officers assisted Detroit Police Auto Theft Unit and recovered two of four cars stolen from Somerset Pontiac at address on Stoepel in Detroit. DPD arrested a 28 year old male resident of Detroit for receiving and concealing stolen property.
