**Assaults:**

**Mon Jin Lau, 1515 E Maple RD, 12/24, 1:30 AM: Two complainants reported being the victims of separate assault & batteries at the restaurant. The first complainant reports that a suspect was harassing a female acquaintance. When he intervened, the male suspect spit gum in the complainant's face. The first complainant informed the second complainant about the incident. They chose to move to another part of the restaurant. However, a fight started. The second complainant reports she was punched in the face twice by a second male suspect. She admitted to punching the suspect after she was hit the second time. The complainant reports an injury to her right eye and cheek bone. The investigation continues.**

The suspect, a 21 year old female resident of Highland Park, and the victim have been fighting over a mutual boyfriend.

Embassy Suites, 850 Tower Drive, 01/01/10, 1:10 am: The Troy Police Department received numerous 9-1-1 telephone calls reporting a large fight in the lobby of the Embassy Suites Hotel. The hotel was the site of a New Year's Eve party attended by approximately 800 persons. Police Officers found a fight in progress involving at least 20 persons. Security officers from a private company hired to staff the event were attempting to establish order. Police Officers began to make arrests. Two of the suspects involved in the fight attacked Police Officers. The Troy Police Department called for mutual aid from the Bloomfield Township Police Department, Clawson Police Department and Oakland County Sheriff's Office. Police Officers restored order after making five arrests.

It is unclear how the fight started. It is believed to have initially involved approximately eight persons on the dance floor. It escalated as security officers intervened in the incident. One victim, a 32 year old male resident of Westland, was transported by Alliance Mobile Health paramedics to Troy Beaumont Hospital for injuries to his jaw and ankle.

#### Home Invasion / B&E

Always secure your doors and windows.

- Garages and door walls are targets for thieves.
- Always ensure your garage door and pedestrian doors are secured.
- Do not leave garage door remote controls in cars not parked in the garage.
- Use 1 ½" dowel rod in the track of all sliding glass windows and doors to help prevent them from opening.
- It has been proven time and time again that the proper use and application of physical security will stop a would-be burglar.
- Burglary alarms are only as reliable as the person setting them. If you have an alarm, make sure that every resident or employee knows how to activate and deactivate it, as well as the

#### Larcenies from Autos / Car Theft

Things that can be done to combat auto theft and larcenies from autos include:

- Installing a car alarm.
- Using steering-wheel locking applications like the club etc.
- Applications of a hidden kill switch to the ignition system.
- Park in a well lit well traveled area if possible.
- Always maintain security of vehicle keys.
- **Do not leave anything of value in your vehicle in plain view.**
- Always lock your vehicle doors.
- Never leave a vehicle unattended while running.
- There is a trend of things being stolen from vehicles in the parking lots of fitness centers and fun centers. While going to these places, be extra careful to remove all items of value and secure your vehicle.

- If someone that you do not know offers to do you a favor, they probably have an ulterior motive.
- Never give any personal information out to an unknown source over the phone or Internet.

(If someone asks for personal information, ask to speak to his or her supervisor and inform him or her you will be calling the Police to make a fraud report.)

**No reputable business will call you or email you for this information!!!**

- If you receive a phone call or email telling you that you have won something that you did not apply for, it is more than likely a fraud.
- No legitimate organization will ask for any money or a Credit Card number in order to claim a prize
- Protect yourself against identity theft by shredding all documents and safe guarding your

*Identity theft continues to be the fastest growing crime in the world, and the city of Troy is no exception. We continually get reports of identity theft and fraud on a regular basis.*

While it may not be totally avoidable, detecting the early signs of identity theft is one of the best ways to avoid extensive losses and damage to your credit history.

If your wallet/purse etc. gets stolen, cancel all stolen credit and ATM cards immediately.

Checking your credit history regularly is a great way to keep apprised on the status of your credit.

Here are three sources for checking your credit
